### Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to Term 2 2017, like any term they are always busy with quality teaching and learning our main focus as well as providing other extra curricula activities to all students. We are looking forward to a productive term whereby the school's strategic directions will be addressed.

There are three main milestones that our teachers will be focusing on this term. The first project will be an action research on developing a comprehensive knowledge of the English syllabus and the NSW Literacy continuum. This will enable consistent teacher judgement on student writing samples in order to collectively identify high impact strategies that will improve student writing.

Our second project will be investigating quality teaching practices in numeracy with close reference to syllabus documents.

Finally, our third major project will be implementing Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) strategies within the school. This is supported through the School Wellbeing Framework and is a research based approach that teaches students skills and expectations needed to achieve success in life. By providing clear expectations and the value of positive interactions, we aim to increase student engagement, promote self regulation which will assist in successful learning. - organising school incursions

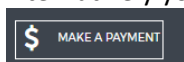

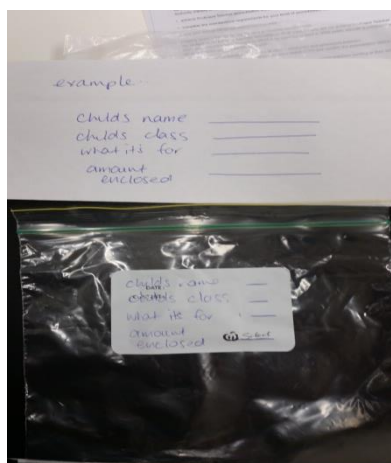

## Confidential family matters and medical reports

If you have any confidential family matters that may impact on your child's wellbeing such as custody issues, **family court orders and medical reports**, please see **Mr Jance** or if I am unavailable to see

Ms Urry before seeing the class teacher. This way the school as a collective can best cater to your child's needs. At the same time, copies of relevant legal or medical documents are required at the school so that we can follow the directions or recommendations. We will do everything to work with you and your child, however, the school can only follow the directions from the courts or medical reports. Once again you are better to see me if there are complex issues and we can work on an action plan.

### **Eye examination for students**

Last Term, the school sent out information and a consent form for an optometrist to conduct a comprehensive eye examination for students. Thank you to the parents and carers who sent the permission notes back to the school. The optometrist will start assessing individual students in Week 4 of this Term.

#### **Signing in and dogs prohibited on school premises**

Due to WHS guidelines and Department of Education policy, it is a requirement to sign in as a visitor at the front office. If you need to deliver something to your child, pick them up early or need to send a message please contact the school office and we can assist in these matters.

Under the Companion Animals Act, 1998 No 87 (14.1.e), all dogs are prohibited in school grounds, (whether or not they are leashed or otherwise controlled). Thank you for understanding and support.

**Please be mindful** on how fast you drive into Barley Rd off Spring Farm Rd as students and parents cross the road, thank you for your understanding

#### **School Helper program**

We have a successful School Helper program and this is due to the successful partnership that exist between parents, carers and class teachers. Teachers and school helpers will negotiate suitable time/s in which assistance is required.

All new school helpers are required to complete an Induction course which outlines the correct procedures for Working with Children Check and highlights the Department of Education Code of Conduct, Child protection and Work Health and Safety guidelines. Please see Mr Jance or Mrs Pereira to complete this course before becoming a school helper.

#### **Lateness**

It is vital that you establish a good routine the night before and in the morning so that your child can get to



school on time. If you have concerns and difficulties with your child's attendance, please do not hesitate to see the school or School Counsellor for advice and assistance.

If your child **arrives late, from 8:55am onwards** they require a late pass from the school office, before going to their lines or classroom.

### **Successful morning and dismissal routines**

A reminder that school gates and **teacher supervision commences at 8:30am**. This is important for the safety of students, as there is no supervision prior to the 8:30am.

I also ask for all parents and carers to **enter the school grounds from 2:45pm onwards** if they are picking up their child or children at 2:55pm. Due to Work Health and Safety requirements, entering the school grounds earlier than 2:45pm, you will be required to sign in at the school office, thank you for your understanding in this matter.

### **The importance of seeing the teacher on duty for any student or parent related matters**

It is important for parents and carers to follow the school's procedures of seeing the teacher on duty in the morning assembly area or in afternoon at dismissal time if they feel a student/s are not following the expectations of the school. **Approaching another child or a group of students in the playground** to try to rectify behaviour is unacceptable, and in fact, is against Department of Education policy.

If your child has friendship issues try to provide them with strategies and solutions so that they may be able to build resilience and problem solving skills. These skills are very valuable and will not only assist your child in their current dispute but will be a skill set they will be able to build upon during their life.

In the event that they are unable to adequately resolve the issue with their peers please refer to the teacher on duty or classroom teacher who will be able to follow up.
