Obeying traffic rules

Please be **mindful of the pedestrians and families** trying to cross the road or get into their vehicles especially in the morning and afternoon, as safety for everyone is paramount. In addition, please be aware of how you park around our **neighbour's properties**.



The school and Camden Council are working together to find the best outcome for the surrounding traffic. Our students and school ask for your patience and understanding especially in the Kiss and Drop Zone where Taxi services (they are usually in mini buses) come to drop off and pick up our students with special needs. They require extra time to organise their students. Please be mindful of this important service and assist by being patient as the students are being dropped off or picked up.

Kiss and Ride area: We have dedicated the South entrance of the school, Harland St, as our “Kiss and Ride” area, where Parents and Carers can pull up and allow their children to alight from the vehicle safely, see them enter the school grounds and continue on their way.

Kiss and Ride Zones

Introduction

Kiss and Ride Zones are designed for your convenience and for your child's safety. Designed for quick entry and exit, these zones minimise congestion and risk when used properly by all parents and carers. These zones operate under the same conditions as no parking zones, which means you may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of 2 minutes. You're required to remain in, or within 3 metres of, your vehicle. Days and hours of operation may apply to some zones.

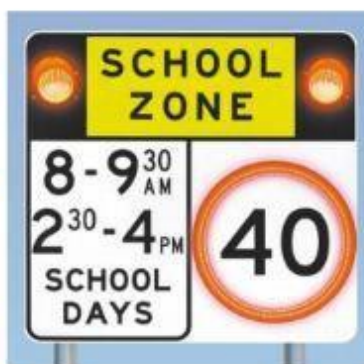

Driving and parking safely near your school

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and drivers outside schools.

You can help keep children safe by remembering the following:

- drop your child off and pick them up on the **school side** of the road
- **never call out to them from across the road - It is very dangerous**
- always take extra care in 40km school zones
- follow all parking signs - these help keep your child as safe as possible
- park responsibly even if it means you have to walk further to the school gate
- never double park - it is illegal and puts children at risk
- never do a U-turn or a three point turn outside the school as it puts children at risk of harm
- model safe and considerate pedestrian and driver behaviours to your child
- always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.

Safety tips

Safety tips for drivers using a Drop-off and Pick-up zones

- Always drop off or pick up your child from the designated zone and follow the school's procedures.
- Drivers should remain in their vehicles at all times in the Drop-off and Pick-up zone.
- Make sure children use the Safety Door (the rear footpath side door) to get in and out of the car.
- Make sure the handbrake is applied when the vehicle is stationary.
- Always park legally.
- Avoid dangerous manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns.

Safety tips for students

- Always get in and out of the vehicle through the Safety Door, the rear footpath-side door.
- Stay buckled up until the vehicle has stopped in the Drop-off and pick-up area.
- Make sure your school bag and other items are in a safe position, such as on the floor.
- Be ready to get out of the vehicle with your belongings when the car has stopped and you have unbuckled your seatbelt.

Safety tips for volunteers

- For easy identification, wear a safety item, such as a fluoro vest, sash or hat.
- Remain on the footpath when helping students to exit and enter each vehicle, in turn, in the Pick-up and Drop-off zone.
- Do not attempt to direct traffic and do not enter the road environment.

Parent Teacher Conferences

Parent Teacher Conferences was a success with parents and carers getting to know the teacher and school programs as well as an opportunity to establish learning goals for students. Thank you to the staff for their dedication to the students and community.

Strategic Directions and teacher professional learning

The school is in the process of finalising the school's strategic directions for the next 3 years. After consultation with students, staff and the community in 2017, the school has collated a number of directions that are aligned with the school's needs and are linked to the Department of Education's Strategic Directions.

This year, the school is focusing on early numeracy training for teachers and implementing several action research projects called Spirals of Inquiry. These professional development workshops focus on the needs of all of our students and will be upskilling the teachers and staff on the strategies to maximise student learning.

The school will continue to implement the Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) strategies, as student wellbeing is always a priority at Spring Farm Public School. The PBL program is linked with the Wellbeing Framework and is a research based approach that teaches students skills and expectations needed to achieve success in life. By providing clear expectations and the value of positive interactions, we aim to increase student engagement, promote self-regulation which will assist in successful learning. Innovative Learning Spaces



Spring Farm Public School was designed for contemporary learning spaces that include, flexible seating, whiteboard top tables and floor cushions. Our furniture is very unique and is the envy of the surrounding schools. Part of the agreement when establishing the school was the ongoing supply of this type of furniture as student enrolments increased. The school is being supplied with this furniture at various times of the year to coincide with the fluctuating enrolments. Most classes are designed for students to work in groups and in flexible seating with their peers. The traditional rows of tables and each student at an individual desk is not conducive to the needs of students in a 21st Century environment.

Flexible learning spaces have developed a collaborative learning culture that fosters growth in maturity and confidence. Students are combining their academic knowledge with the emotional and social challenges that come with a collaborative learning environment. Importantly, students are developing the ability to actively communicate, collaborate, and think critically in these flexible learning spaces. These skills are a necessity for future learning and being a productive and successful citizen. It is also a major focus of the Department of Education's goals. More information can be accessed:

School Helper program


We have a successful School Helper program and this is due to the successful partnership that exist between parents, carers and class teachers. Teachers and school helpers will negotiate suitable time/s in which assistance is required.

All school helpers are required to complete an Induction course which outlines the correct procedures for Working with Children Check and highlights the Department of Education Code of Conduct, Child protection and Work Health and Safety guidelines. Please email the school to organise an induction course before becoming a school helper.

Lateness

It is vital that you establish a good routine the night before and, in the morning, so that your child can get to school on time. If you have concerns and difficulties with your child's attendance, please do not hesitate to see the school or School Counsellor for advice and assistance.

If your child **arrives late, from 8:55am onwards** they require a late pass from the school office, before going to their lines or classroom.

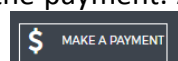

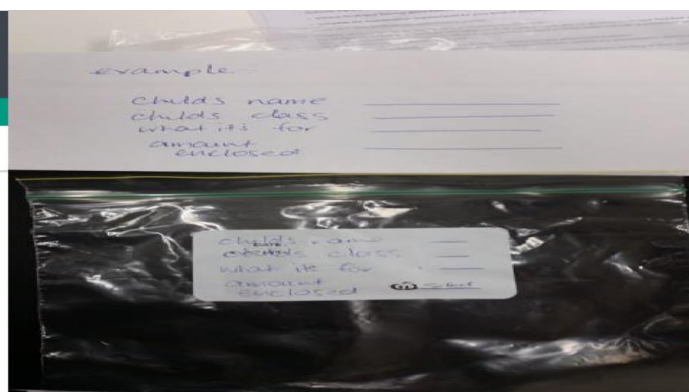

ACTIVE KIDS VOUCHER

From 2018 as part of the focus on reducing childhood overweight and obesity, the NSW government will provide a \$100 voucher to parents/guardians of school enrolled children to use for sport and fitness activities.

Summary of the Active Kids Rebate:

- Voucher can be used for registration and participation costs for sport and fitness activities from a wide range of providers.
- Every family in NSW with a child enrolled in school from Kindergarten to Year 12 will be

eligible

- One voucher will be available for every child in the family annually over the next four years
- Families can start claiming vouchers from 31 January 2018
- The Office of Sport will facilitate applications
